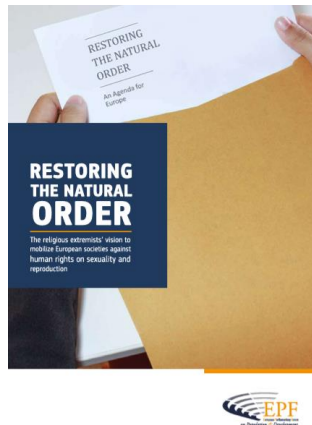
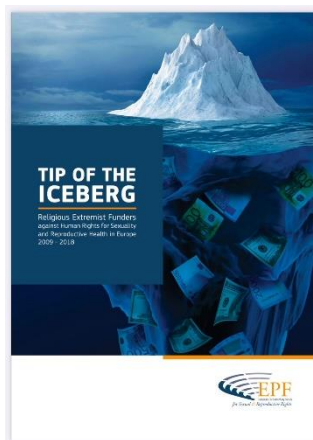


Upcoming business of interest and opportunities to raise Global Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR)
