
Upcoming business of interest and opportunities to raise Global Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR)


The APPG on Global Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights is extremely disappointed by the recent announcement that UK overseas development aid is to be cut to pay for increased defence spending. Women and girls will pay the heaviest price. Family planning and life-saving maternity services will not be available when needed.

In our Chair Sarah Champion MP's <u>response</u> to the cuts in her capacity as Chair of the International Development Committee, she says *"I urge the Prime Minister to rethink today's announcement. Cutting the aid budget to fund defence spending is a false economy that will only make the world less safe."*

It was announced today that International Development Minister Anneliese Dodds had <u>resigned</u> in protest at the decision.

Increasing the defence budget will be funded by cutting foreign aid
