1. Welcome

The meeting began at 1 pm and Carol Monaghan MP, Chair of the ME APPG, welcomed all attendees and introduced the guest speakers.

Carol Monaghan then explained the meeting purpose which was to highlight the condition of ME in children and to use expert contributions to produce a report paper on the key issues impacting ME sufferers.

Dr Charles Shepherd, ME APPG Secretariat, briefly summarised the key issues which stem from lack of education and information going out to professionals working with children with ME. Charles mentioned that the NICE 2007 guidelines barely even mentioned children, citing ME incorrectly as a behavioural problem rather than a neurological disorder.
