
Towards Zero Foundation

The UN General Assembly

Global Network for Road Safety Legislators



- Launched December 2016 in London
- To unite the voices of parliamentarians and parliamentary bodies in order to strengthen advocacy efforts aimed at accelerating action to reduce road traffic deaths and injuries globally
- Regional chapters launched in South-East Asia and Latin America



Putting Road Safety on the Commonwealth Agenda

- Commonwealth countries suffer over 500,000 road fatalities every year
- Road injury is the world's number one cause of death of children and young people between the ages of five and twenty nine
- Over 60% of the population of the Commonwealth are aged under 30
